About ERS

Somalia has been at war for three decades; communities have lost people and property in the process. ERS is committed to supporting vulnerable communities to live safer, healthier, and more stable lives, ensuring people can access the essential services they need to get back on their feet.

Report on Distribution of Food

Food distribution for IDPs in Budbud and Tifow camps is crucial in addressing the urgent humanitarian needs of those displaced by conflict and natural disasters, as well as those who have been in the camps for an extended period. Life-saving food was delivered through well-wishers and friends and distributed by ERS. The food contains rice, sugar, and cooking oil; only 400 households have been identified, though the households in need are 686.

Introduction

This report summarizes the needs of the internally displaced persons (IDPs) in the two camps, with a total of 686 IDP households: 417 in Budbud and 269 in Tifow, in Garasbaley District, Mogadishu, Somalia. It addresses the urgent humanitarian needs of IDPs residing in the area, including newly arrived IDPs and those who have been in the camps for an extended period. The report highlights critical gaps in essential services, including shelter, sanitation, lack of latrines, healthcare, food security, and education. There is a significant influx of IDPs who recently arrived from drought-affected areas, including Jambalul and the Ugunji region of Bokool in Hudur district. Many of these individuals lack basic necessities such as shelter, food, and healthcare, increasing their vulnerability. Additionally, the overall hygiene and sanitation in the IDP camps are alarmingly poor, with a severe shortage of water and lack of toilets contributing to unhygienic living conditions.

Despite the availability of emergency medicines and healthcare, challenges remain pressing, particularly concerning the deteriorating nutritional status of children within the camps. The widespread food insecurity affects both long-term IDPs and newly arrived families, further straining the already limited resources. Moreover, access to education is severely constrained, with no children reaching the primary education level, leaving a generation at risk of illiteracy and reduced future opportunities.

This report aims to provide an in-depth analysis of these urgent humanitarian concerns and to



offer recommendations for immediate interventions to improve the living conditions of the affected populations in Budbud and Tifow camps in Garasbaley, Banadir district.

Emergency Needs and Recommendations

1. ****Shelter and Bedding****

Immediate provision of emergency shelter and bedding materials to newly displaced families. This will include tents, tarpaulins, and basic bedding kits.

2. ****Healthcare Emergency and Medicine****

Deployment of mobile health clinics and medical teams to provide primary healthcare services, including maternal and child health services. Distribution of essential medicines, particularly for waterborne diseases.

3. ****Food Security****

Increased food aid and nutrition programs to ensure food security for both long-term and newly displaced persons. Provision of cash assistance to families to enable them to purchase food and other essentials.

4. ****Education****

Establishment of temporary learning spaces (TLS) and community-based education programs to provide basic education to IDP children. Provision of educational material

Conclusion

The needs of internally displaced persons in Budbud and Tifowl Garasbaley Banadir district, Mogadishu has highlighted critical gaps in shelter ,food security healthcare and sanitation, education, nutrition for IDPs.the influx of newly displaced persons due to drought and conflict has further strained limited resources, immediate action is required to provide emergency assistance while developing long-term solutions coordination among humanitarian agencies, government and community stakeholders is essential to effectively address these pressing issues and improve the living conditions of IDPs.
